## YOU help children and families

"My 15-year-old daughter Lilia experienced the loss of 15 people over a short period. This trauma caused her to become withdrawn and argumentative, often isolating herself in her room for most of the day. I didn't realize how serious the situation was until she ended up in the hospital due to a suicide attempt.

We were referred to the Parent Child Resource Center, where Lilia received individual therapy and participated in an Intensive Outpatient Program. Through this program, she developed coping skills and began to process her trauma. My husband and I also learned how to support her and rebuild our trust with her. We are incredibly grateful for everything the Parent Child Resource Center has done for us."


